


Everything you need to know about preprints Free online lecture April 15th, 2021, 12pm-1pm EST

This session will discuss how to embed preprints in your workflow and help you to understand their impact on scholarly communication in relation to COVID-19 and biomedicine more generally



Dr. Jessica Polka serves as executive director of ASAPbio, a research-driven nonprofit organization working to promote innovation and transparency in life sciences publishing in areas such as preprinting and open peer review. Prior to this, she performed postdoctoral research in the department of Systems Biology at Harvard Medical School following a PhD in Biochemistry & Cell Biology from UCSF. Jessica is also a Plan S Ambassador, an affiliate of the Knowledge Futures Group, and a steering committee member of Rescuing Biomedical Research.

Dr. John Inglis is the co-founder of bioRxiv and medRxiv, Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory's preprint services for the life and health sciences. He is also the founding Executive Director and Publisher of Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory Press in New York, a not-for-profit publisher of journals, books, and online media in molecular and cellular biology. John is current chair of the Board of Directors of Life Science Alliance, a joint publishing venture of Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory, Rockefeller University, and EMBO, and serves on the Advisory Boards of MIT Press and the Research on Research Institute. He graduated from the University of Edinburgh Medical School with a Ph.D. in immunology and was previously Assistant Editor of The Lancet, founder of Trends in Immunology and Trends in Parasitology, and Managing Editor of the Trends journals.
